- The NY State Legislature amended NY State's Elder Law— Section 202, Subsection 24-d, Subdivision 14— which
- Directed the NY State Office for the Aging, in cooperation with the State Department of State, to
- Make available to cities, towns, and villages model zoning and planning guidelines that foster ageintegrated communities including mixed-use, ageintegrated communities.

NYS Livable New York Initiative

- NY State's Elder Law Section 202 also
- Directed the NY State Office for the Aging, in consultation with the State Division of Housing and Community Renewal, to
- Make recommendations to the Governor and Legislature for assisting mixed-use, ageintegrated housing development or redevelopment demonstration projects in urban, suburban, and rural areas of the state.

NYS Livable New York Initiative

- NY State's Elder Law Section 202 also
- Directed the NY State Office for the Aging and the State Department of State to establish an Advisory Committee for the initiative, comprising
- Representatives from
 - Local governments
 - Community organizations
 - Developers and planners
 - Senior services providers
 - Others

This initiative was originally named "Housing, Planning, & Zoning Initiative." As the initiative expanded in scope and intent, it was renamed Livable New York.
