





Percent Change, 2000 to 2007





Components of Population Change New York, 1960 to 2007





In-Migrants to New York by Origin, All Ages, 1995 to 2000





Out-Migrants from New York by Destination, All Ages, 1995 to 2000





In-Migrants to New York by Origin, 65 and Over, 1995 to 2000





Out-Migrants from New York by Destination, 65 and Over, 1995 to 2000



Net Migration Rate by Age, 1990-2000





Out-Migrants 65 and Over, Selected Destinations, 1995 to 2000








Percent Change by Race and Hispanic Origin, Population 65 and Over, 2000 to 2007



Living Arrangements of Persons 65 and Over, New York State, 2000





Homeownership of Householders 65 and Over, 2006





Percent of the 65 and Over Population with Various Disabilities, New York State, 2000




